# Logical Outlines: Three Key Points

**Point One:** Different tasks for each chapter:

- ▶ Chapters 1-2: Subset based (but caution: avoid falling for a subset).
- ▶ Chapter 3: Requires three premises.
- ▶ Chapters 4-5: Full sketches; more work but all-encompassing by definition.

# Logical Outlines: Citation Practices

- ▶ Citing is allowed, especially with precise page numbers.
- ▶ Use minimal quotes (e.g., one line) to capture the essence.
- ▶ Avoid copying and pasting entire paragraphs.

# Logical Outlines: Labels and Explanations

- ▶ Use labels and explanatory/justificatory tags.
- ▶ There is one label for justificatory.
- ▶ Multiple tags exist for explanatory (e.g., *what* and *how*).
